John Larkin Is 2010 Men's Golf Champion

John Larkin Spell, one of the finest natural talents you'll ever see on a golf course, was an easy winner in the rain-shortened 2010 Men's Club Championship.

John Larkin, son of Coharie member Micki McPhail and stepson of Dr. John McPhail, shot a 7-under-par 65 to win by six strokes over Mark Miller. Senior Bob Yow came in third with a par-matching 72.

The championship was supposed to be a 36-hole event, but about halfway through the final round thunderstorms, accompanied by lightning and heavy rain, forced professional Dickie Walters to call the

action to a halt. Play was never able to resume, so the winners were determined by first-day scores.

The First Flight was a much more competitive race, with Ashley "Bird" Odum shooting a 6-over-par 78 to take the first-day lead.

Behind him by a stroke were a couple of chargers, Whit Tart and Bill Dunlap, who didn't get a chance to strut their stuff because of the second-day rainout. Tied with them was the has-been Roy Brown, who was fouling up big-time on Sunday when the weather turned foul.

He was a member of Graves Memorial Presbyterian Church in Clinton.

Col. MacGill graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1957, the same year he married Ann Barwick, his wife of 53 years.

His military service included two tours in Vietnam, 1964-1965 and 1967-1968. He

was awarded a number of medals, including the Air Medal with Valor and eight Oakleaf Clusters, the Bronze Star three times, for valor twice.

He is survived by his wife, Ann Barwick MacGill; daughter, Mary MacGill Stokes and husband, Brian of Pittsboro and son, James Fulton MacGill, Jr and wife, Rena of Raleigh; four grandchildren
