You almost want to say, "Poor Kathy, she's in a much better

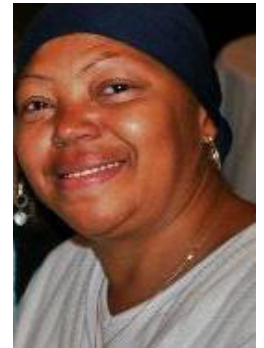
place now."

Mrs. Fatch is North Carolina Teacher of the Year

About a year ago, social studies teacher Jennifer Facciolini was named Teacher of the Year for 2009/2010 at Midway High School.

Months later, she was selected Sampson County Schools Teacher of the Year for 2009/2010.

In February, Mrs. Facciolini was chosen N.C. Southeast Region 2 Teacher of the Year.

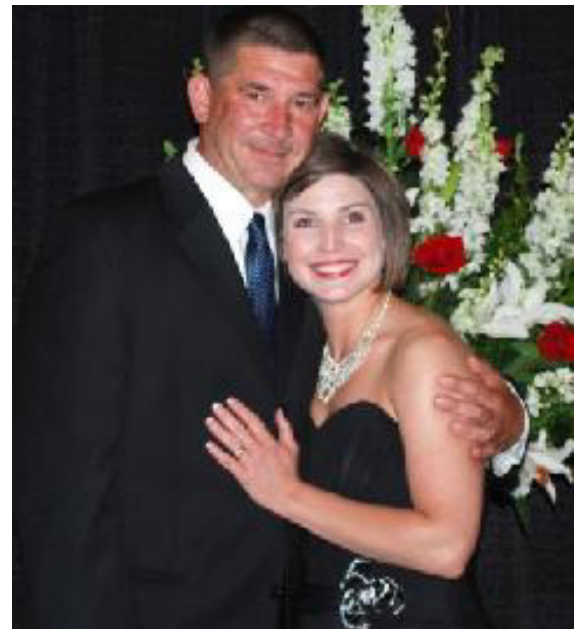
Then, on the evening of May 5th, the wife of Coharie Country Club bartender Mike Facciolini was named the 2010-11 AT&T North Carolina Teacher of the Year at a banquet held in Cary.

Jennifer received a framed certificate to commemorate the honor, but there are substantial additional rewards to come.

She'll spend the next school year traveling the state as an ambassador for the teaching profession and will be given an automobile to use during the year she serves as Teacher of the Year, an engraved plaque, a one-time cash award of \$7,500, a trip to the National Teacher of the Year conference, the opportunity to travel abroad through an endowment at the North Carolina Center for International Under-

standing, and a technology package valued at over \$17,000 from SMART Technologies. She also will serve as an advisor to the State Board of Education for two years.

2010 Pool Rules for Coharie Country Club

- 1. Lifeguards are in charge of the pool area at all times. Do not engage in conversation or distract lifeguards on duty.**
- 2. Parents are required to watch their children (under age 9) in all areas of the pool. (Diving board, slide, shallow end of pool, and bathrooms)**
- 3. Children age 9 and older must pass a swimming test and their parents must sign a consent form before being left unattended at the pool.**
- 4. Lifeguards will remove swimmers for threatening weather.**
- 5. *Members must sign-in all visitors.(see below)**
- 6. In town visitors must wear their guest bracelet at all times.**
- 7. Adults and lifeguards only are allowed in the pool during break.**
- 8. Adult alcoholic beverages must be in styrofoam cups.**
- 9. Place all trash in trash cans provided.**
- 10. Only one person allowed on diving board at a time.**
- 11. Proper swimming attire is required. No cut off jeans, khakis, etc.**
- 12. Anyone caught inside pool area, while closed, will be suspended for the entire summer.**
- 13. Non-member babysitters must be with the member's children and must sign in as their guest.**
- 14. The "No" Rules:**
 - a. No glass containers or bottles**
 - b. No food, drinks, or gum in the pool**
 - c. No skateboards, rollerblades, bicycles or golf carts inside fence**
 - d. No running or horse playing**
 - e. No hanging or standing on the division ropes in the pool**
 - f. No hanging from diving board, slide, or basketball goal**
 - g. No diving in the shallow end of the pool**
 - h. No dogs or other animals inside the fence**
 - i. No use of profanity, underage drinking, or illegal drugs**
 - j. No display of public affection**
 - k. No loitering in the parking lot**
 - l. No sneaking in visitors without "sign-up"**

What happens if we violate the rules:

1st offense-verbal warning

2nd offense- 30 minute suspension

3rd offense- 1 day suspension

4th offense-pool review board (options:1-2-3 week suspension or loss of club privileges)

***Members who choose to violate the rules will have their name, date and offense written in the pool journal. Offenses will accrue and punishment will follow!**

afternoon of Saturday, May 22, Kathy's funeral was held in Lakewood High School's gymnasium on Sunday, May 23. An estimated 750-1,000 people attended.

The Rev. Dr. John Troy told the audience they were acting as though they were attending a funeral. He said that the ceremony was a celebration of Kathy's Christian life.

The program handed out to attendees included a "Change of Address" notice from

Kathy.

"My new home is a sight to behold," she said. "It is located on an exclusive estate area behind a beautiful pearly gate. It is just over the other side of the celestial shore. Of course, you know the streets are paved with gold and every day is Sunday... Trees with 12 manners of fruit grace my garden here and I can walk and talk with my Heavenly Father.

"... There is peace here, joy, happiness, no pain or headaches,

no pills or doctors, no strife or discontent, only sweet serenity.

"I can dine at the Master's table and listen to a heavenly choir, but best of all my Heavenly Father is here in all His glory!"

"Oh yes, I have my own designer who has fitted me with my very own white robe and my wings.

"... I'm gonna pray that you get to move here yourself one day. But before I close, let me give you my new address."

dent June Atkinson said Facciolini is a wonderful example of the exceptional teachers leading public school classrooms across the state. "Jennifer finds ways to make social studies relevant to her students so that they connect with the events and people and remember what they've learned," Atkinson said. "She understands that education is not about teaching, but students learning."

State Board of Education Chairman Bill Harrison also congratulated Facciolini on her selection saying, "As a former principal, I know what a highly motivated teacher can accomplish in the classroom. The students at Midway High School are incredibly fortunate to have such a champion working hard on their behalf to ensure that they are successful in the classroom and in life."

In accepting the award, Facciolini said that as the AT&T North Carolina Teacher of the Year she would communicate the importance of educating each child. "Often in education we have been presented with a 'shoot to the middle' philosophy and we fail to teach each child. It is imperative that we assess

where each child is academically and work to improve and expand upon their knowledge and skills. Our future depends on the total education of every student."

Jennifer has 11 years of teaching experience and has taught social studies for the last three at Midway High School. She is a member of the Professional Educators of North Carolina and the Parent Teacher Association.

She mentors beginning teachers, supervises and mentors student teachers, chairs Midway High's School Improvement Team, chairs the school's Social Studies Department and participates in staff development presentations. In addition to her most recent awards, Jennifer also received the Fuquay-Varina Chamber of Commerce Excellence in Education Award in 2006 and was a Wake County Teacher of the Year semifinalist in 2006.

Mrs. Fatch completed her undergraduate studies at Meredith College where she received a Bachelor of Arts in American Civilization and Secondary Social Studies Certification. She achieved National Board Certification in 2005.
