Our Bob Yow Dominates A Pair of CGA One-Day Events

Bob Yow recently had a big week playing golf in the Wilmington area, finishing in the top 20 in one big event and absolutely dominating in two other tournaments.

His journey began when he and partner Cliff Seastrunk of Raleigh participated in the 42nd Carolinas Senior Four-Ball Championship at Porters Neck CC in Wilmington, Apr. 20-22.

Bob and Cliff shot 71-70-68-209 to tie for 16th place, which earned each \$150 in merchandise.

The championship was won by N.C. Sports Hall of Famer Paul Simson and his partner Don Detweiler, both of Raleigh.

After taking a day off, Bob played in the Carolinas Golf Association One-Day tournament

at Pine Valley CC in Wilmington. Among a large field of senior men, Bob's 70 was five strokes better than the second-place finisher.

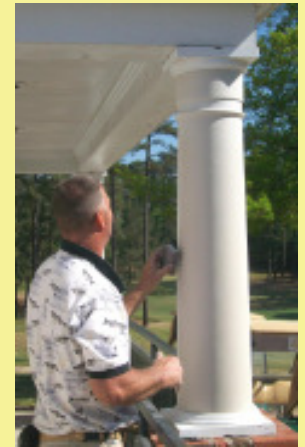
That added another \$75 to his collection of merchandise booty.

Carolinas Interclub Matches Kick Off May 2

The Carolinas Interclub Matches begin for Coharie CC this Sunday (May 2) when we host Birchwood CC of Nashville, NC in our first match of the season.

Remember, there's a new player eligibility policy this year. Players must be at least 21 years old and must have posted a **minimum of 10 scores within the past 12 months.**

Players also are required to have a low handicap index of **18.4 or less** in order to be eligible to participate.
