Club Championship



Twenty-four golfers gathered on September 17 & 18 to compete in this year's Club Championship. Eight players competed in the second flight, seven players in the first flight, eight players were in the championship flight and Rick Reece defeated Rick in the senior flight.

John Larkin Spell was crowned this year's club champion after shooting rounds of 74 & 71 for a 145 total. Placing second was Brooks Barwick with rounds of 73 & 74 for a 147 total. Jeffery Spell shot 76-75 for a 151 total to place third in the championship flight.

Smokey Norris was the winner in the first flight after carding rounds of 81 & 77 for a 158 total. Bill Dunlap was a close second with scores

of 82 & 77 for a 159 total. Marvin Mitchell and Bill Turlington shot identical scores of 81 each day to finish tied with a total of 162. Marvin Mitchell was awarded third place after a scorecard playoff.

In the second flight, Greg Norris rebounded from a first day 83 to shoot 74 on Sunday and claim the top spot with a 157 total. Jeff Heath shot an opening day 84 and followed that up with a 75 for a 159 total, good for second place. Randy Wiggins shot 84-76 and Michael Mason shot 83-77 for a total of 160. Wiggins was awarded third place following a scorecard play-off.

Rick Reece was awarded the senior flight championship after shooting 79-85 for a total of 164 to defeat Rick by one stroke.

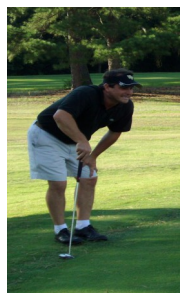

Coharie Challenge

Congratulations to Whit Tart for winning last months Coharie Challenge. Here is the answer:

Donald Ross is the answer to last month's question. On February 28, 1947 the Board appointed F.L. Turlington to contact Ross for consultation and to secure a bid for the construction of a golf course. Ross of Pinehurst, considered by many to be America's best known and active golf course architect, was busy with several projects and in failing health (He died the following year). He led Turlington to a young Ellis Maples. Maples' father, Frank, was a longtime construction superintendent for Ross. Ellis worked alongside and under the tutelage of his father and Ross, and by 1947 had been involved in Ross projects and several re-designs of his own. On March 7, 1947 the Board approved a contract with Ellis Maples for the design of a nine-hole golf course. Coharie as it turns out would be his first solo design. Confirmed by his son, Joe, who was a student at the time at Edwards Military Institute in nearby Salemburg, and who assisted his father that summer.
